Iran is again in the news today. In order to understand this important country and its ambitions and goals in this vital part of the world, it helps to know something about its history, its culture and its people. In 2015, Tom Tauber traveled in Iran for two weeks, from Tehran to Kerman, Persepolis, Yazd and Isfahan. In a 50-minute lecture with photographs he will share his views of the beauty, vitality, history, architecture, people and culture of this intriguing country, and provide some insight regarding its recent tumultuous history.



Tom Tauber is a native of Vienna, Austria. He came to the US in 1965 on a Fulbright scholarship and received a Ph.D. in Theoretical Physics from Lehigh University. Tom joined an aerospace company in the Philadelphia area, received eight US patents for his work and retired as President of the company. After his retirement, he took up digital photography. He enjoys traveling with his cameras, and his extensive participation in international exhibitions has led to five Photographic Society of America (PSA) galaxies in Photo Travel and multiple PSA star ratings in Photojournalism, Projected Images and Prints. After two years as chair of the Photo Travel Division of PSA, he currently serves on its executive committee as Past Chair.
